Sponsoring Institutions must provide a Sponsoring Letter of Agreement (SLOA) that states the Institution takes responsibility for funding and oversight of the program which includes faculty, facilities (e.g., MRI, neurosurgical ICU, operating rooms) and other necessary resources to maintain and support the fellowship program. The Institution may be an anesthesiology department, hospital, medical school or the national medical education organization. This must be stated in the SLOA. ### **Sponsoring Letter of Agreement (SLOA)**

All additional participating sites or programs require a Clinical Site Letter of Agreement (CSLOA) from the clinical sites' Department Chairman or Division Chief (e.g., Director NeuroICU). The CSLOA must designate the individual directly responsible for the training and the training provided. This requirement includes all sites or rotations that are not under the direct control of the sponsoring Department of Anesthesiology (e.g., Department of Neurosurgery).
